HTI's Company Publicist Lyla Miklos was named the 2003 Hamilton Woman of the Year in Communications at the 28th Annual Women of the Year Awards Ceremony on Thursday, May 20th at the Hamilton Convention Centre.

Organized by the Hamilton Status of Women Committee the awards recognize outstanding achievements and contributions in furthering the position of Hamilton-area women. The award for Women in Communications goes out to a woman who has accomplished outstanding achievements within the broadest sense of communications systems: i.e. media, education or public forums.

Chair of the Hamilton Status of Women's Committee' (Irene Sushko) introduction from the May 20th awards ceremony:
