# 1. OVERTURE Selections from "The Prayer Cycle" (Jonathan Elias)

(This music will start to play at 10:15am, unless musicians are still rehearsing. The Sanctuary doors should also open at this time. Remind the Ushers to direct congregants to bring their photos to the front of the Sanctuary while the Gathering Music plays)

# 2. BELL

LYLA: (At 10:2am ring the bell in the foyer.)

(Indicate to the Sound Tech that the service will begin in five more minutes and that you will need your podium mike turned on the music on CD turned down so everyone can hear you introduce the Gathering Music.)

### 3. GATHERING MUSIC Selections from "The Prayer Cycle" (Jonathan Elias)

LYLA: Please quietly take your seats as we enjoy our Gathering Music.

We ask that you turn off any cell phones, pagers, blackberrys, or other electronic devices as they interfere with our sound system and your listening enjoyment during the service.

Any congregants who brought photos of their dead loved ones in honour of Samhain *(pronounced SOW-wen)*, are asked to bring them forward and place them at the front of the Sanctuary at this time.

(Indicate to the Sound Tech that the music on CD needs to be turned off and you will need your podium mike turned on so everyone can hear Rachel lead them in the SINGING TOGETHER.)

# 4. SINGING TOGETHER

Cauldron Of Changes (Origin Unknown)

**RACHEL:** Good Morning! Please rise as you're able and let's join our voices together in song. This morning we'll sing "Cauldron Of Changes". The lyrics can be found in your Order of Service.

(Rachel will give instruction to the congregation on how to sing this song.)

**CONGREGANTS:** Cauldron of changes, feather on the bone, arc of eternity, ring made of stone. We are the old people. We are the new people. We are the same people. Wiser than before.

# 5. WELCOME AND SINGING BOWL

LYLA: Good Morning!

Welcome to the First Unitarian Church of Hamilton.

Whoever you are, whomever you love, wherever you are on your journey of faith or search for meaning, today you are one of us, and you are welcome in this house of worship.

My name is Lyla Miklos and I am your Service Leader along with Todd Fraleigh this morning.

Today is our annual UN Sunday service. We are deeply honoured to have Bruce Knotts, Executive Director of the Unitarian Universalist United Nations Office, as our Speaker and Storyteller today. Bruce, a retired US diplomat, became the ED for the UU-UNO in 2008. In 2010 he was unanimously elected as Chair of the United Nations NGO Committee on Human Rights. He also Chairs the Faith and Ethics Network for the International Criminal Court.

The UU-UNO's focus this year is on the issue of climate change. Bruce will be sharing with us many exciting stories about the amazing work of the UU-UNO.

Today is also Halloween. For many Hamiltonians, this is a time to dress up in cool costumes, have fun house parties, and go door-to-door collecting candy. For several Earth-centered traditions, today is also known as Samhain *(pronounced SOW-wen)* a sacred day to mark the end of the harvest and to honour our dead loved ones. Samhain *(pronounced SOW-wen)* is a time of reflection, of looking back over the last year, of coming to terms with the phenomenon of life over which we have no control – death. On this night the veil between the living and the dead is said to be at its thinnest.

May we remember our ancestors and all those we have loved who have gone before as we close our eyes, and listen to the sound of our singing bowl until it disappears.

(play the singing bowl . . . and fade)

### 6. CALL TO WORSHIP #445 The Womb of Stars by Joy Atkinson

**TODD:** Good Morning!

Please join me in reading our Call To Worship, *The Womb of Stars* by Joy Atkinson. It is reading #445 in your grey hymnal. I will begin the reading and you will respond with the word in italics.

(Give congregants a moment to find their place in the grey hymnal.)

**TODD:** The womb of stars embraces us; remnants of their fiery furnaces pulse through our veins.

**CONGREGANTS:** We are of the stars, the dust of the explosions casts across space.

**TODD:** We are of the earth: we breathe and live in the breath of ancient planets and beasts.

**CONGREGANTS:** Their cells nourish the soil; we build our communities on their harvest of gifts.

**TODD:** Our fingers trace the curves carved in clay and stone by forebears unknown to us.

**CONGREGANTS:** We are a part of the great circle of humanity gathered around the fire, the hearth, the altar.

**TODD:** We gather anew this day to celebrate our common heritage.

**CONGREGANTS:** May we recall in gratitude all that has given us birth.

Everyone please join us in singing our UN Sunday Children's Recessional Hymn, *Go Now in Peace*, found in your order of service as Chrissy and Leah leadsour children to CYRE.

Go now in peace. Go now in peace. May the spirit of love surround you. Everywhere. Everywhere. You may go.

Please be seated.

**LYLA:** Our announcements are part of our life as a church community. Please make a point of reading all the announcements in your order of service following today's service. We have a few announcements, which you won't find in your Order of Service.

**LYLA:** Please join me in reading our unison words of support found in your order of service.

**CONGREGATION:** Sorrow will one day turn to joy. All that breaks the heart and oppresses the soul will one day give place to peace and understanding and everyone will be free.

#### 24. HYMN #1067 Mother Earth, Beloved Garden (STJ)

**LYLA:** Please stand as you are able and join together in singing hymn number #1067 from your aqua hymnal entitled *Mother Earth, Beloved Garden*.

**CONGREGATION:** Mother Earth, beloved garden Living treasure under foot, All our days you ground our being: Sage and thistle, grass and root. Herbs to heal us, plants to feed us, Land to till and tend and plow. With the pendant, deep as midnight, North we ask you: be here now.

LYLA: For telling ourselves and others that evil is inevitable while good is impossible,

CONGREGATION: may we stand corrected.
